Following agreement between the Councils of the three societies, the first ever joint meeting of MINSOC, MSA and MAC will be held in Cambridge in June 2007. The scientific focus of the meeting will be on recent advances in research into the properties and behaviour of minerals, together with their geological contexts in rocks and biosystems, under the overall theme of "Frontiers in Mineral Sciences".
