INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE PHYSICS OF SEMICONDUCTORS

The Institute and Society on behalf of the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics, and the British National Committee for Physics are arranging an International Conference on The Physics of Semiconductors, which will be held at the University of Exeter from 16-20 July, 1962. The Conference is planned to follow the previous sequence of Conferences on the physics of semiconductors, which were held in Reading in 1950, Amsterdam in 1954, Garmisch in 1956, Rochester in 1958 and Prague in 1960. Accommodation will be provided in Halls of Residence at the University. ELEVENTH CLAY MINERALS CONFERENCE

The main theme of the Conference will be CLAY MINERALS TRANSFORMATIONS—WEATHERING and DIAGENESIS. Papers will be invited on this subject as well as on other aspects of clay mineralogy.
