EIGHTH CONFERENCE ON SILICATE INDUSTRY BUDAPEST, 7-12 June, 1965

The Eighth Conference on Silicate Industry will be organized by the Scientific Society of the Silicate Industry on June 7–12, 1965. Program of the Conference

Subjects will be discussed at the Conference, covering the entire field of the various branches in the silicate industry. An acknowledged expert will be invited to sum up each subject in a Principal Paper with special emphasis on recent development. The length of the lecture is about 40 minutes, to be followed by a discussion. Registered contributors may take the floor for a maximum of 20 minutes to give an account of their own research work and their own opinions on the subject. The time ensured for unregistered contributions has been fixed in 5 minutes.

The Organizing Committee will provide for the simultaneous interpretation of the lectures and discussions in two other official languages.

Order of the Conference

On the first day is the inaugural meeting followed by a cocktail party. From the second day lectures and discussions are held in the morning and afternoon in two sections. Care will be taken that related subjects should not be discussed at the same time. The Organizing Committee will publish the full text of the principal papers in the original language with

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a summary in five languages as a preprint in advance to the Conference. The entire text, including the contributory reports and discussions will be published in the journal of The Scientific Society of the Silicate Industry "Épitöanyag" and as a separate "Proceedings" volume, in Hungarian and English languages, respectively, after the Conference.

Fees

The membership fee of the Conference is \$12.00 (or equivalent). The membership fee can be paid in the office of the Conference at the time of registration. The sum can be sent in advance to the account of the National Bank of Hungary No. 171249—70, in which case be sure to put the mark "SILICONF" on it.

The membership fee entitles participants to:

1) the preprint of the Conference;

- 2) the use of the equipment for simultaneous interpretation;
- 3) participation at the cocktail party and reception;
- 4) sight-seeing-tour round Budapest.

The fee for the trip is \$6.00 (or equivalent) and includes the fare, lunch, visit to the plant and (weather permitting) entrance ticket to the beach, providing opportunity for bathing. The selection of Dr. William T. Pecora as Chief Geologist to head the Geologic Division of the Geological Survey has been announced by the Department of the Interior. The 51-year-old earth scientist is a specialist in mineralogy and petrology with special emphasis on the geochemistry of volcanic rocks. He formerly was Chief, Geochemistry and Petrology Branch, and replaces Dr. Charles A. Anderson, who will resume research on the geology and the ore deposits of the southwestern United States.

Drs. Duncan McConnell and Dan McLachlan, Jr. have been appointed professors of mineralogy at the Ohio State University. Dr. McConnell, former chairman of the mineralogy department, retains his research professorship in the college of dentistry. Dr. McLachlan was until recently professor of metallurgy, mineralogy and physics at the University of Denver.

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MINERALOGICAL SOCIETY OF AMERICA—AMERICAN CRYSTALLOGRAPHIC ASSOCIATION SUMMER MEETING

Gatlinburg, Tennessee

June 27-July 2, 1965

The Mineralogical Society of America will hold its second summer meeting, with the American Crystallographic Association, in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, June 27–July 2, 1965. Two days of scientific sessions and two or three days of field trips are being planned. The joint meeting will be sponsored by the Oak Ridge National Laboratory, operated by Union Carbide Corporation for the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission. Sessions will be held in the Gatlinburg Civic Auditorium.

To encourage the contribution of the most recent and up-to-date achievements of the membership, the Program Committee has set the deadlines nearly a month closer to meeting time than was the case for the 1964 Summer Meeting. For this change to be practical the deadlines must be enforced rigorously. A deadline date is the date for receipt of a title or abstract in the office of the Program Committee. It is not the date of a postmark or covering letter.
