JEWELL JEANNETTE GLASS December 24, 1888-January 28, 1966

Jewell Jeannette Glass was a mineralogist professionally and at heart. Her important contributions included studies of beryllium minerals; a study of bastnaesite from California, which contributed to the discovery of the greatest known deposit of this rare-earth mineral in the world; and her discovery of the manganese mineral pyroxmangite in Idaho. Miss Glass left an unrestricted gift of her residuary estate to the Mineralogical Society of America. In recognition of this gift of approximately \$4,000, the Council of the Mineralogical Society of America dedicated to her this issue of the American Mineralogist.
