

Proceedings of the Sixtieth Annual Meeting of the Mineralogical Society of America in San Diego, California

The sixtieth annual meeting of the Society was held on November 4-8, 1979, in San Diego, California. There were two technical sessions in mineralogy, six in petrology, and a symposium, "Properties of Silicate Melts," organized by Bjørn Mysen. The technical sessions were integrated with those of the Geological Society of America and other affiliated societies of GSA.

The retiring president, David R. Wones, addressed the Society on the subject, "Contributions of Crystallography, Mineralogy and Petrology to the Geology of the Lucerne Pluton, Hancock County, Maine." The annual luncheon followed the address of President Wones. The Roebling Medal was presented to W. H. Taylor, who was introduced by Joseph V. Smith. The Mineralogical Society of America Award was presented to Ho-Kwang Mao, who was introduced by William A. Bassett.

At the annual business meeting, reports were presented by the Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Editor. The results of the election and Council Actions were announced.

1979 Council Actions

The second meeting of the 1979 Council was held on May 31, 1979 and the third meeting on November 4, 1979. The principal actions taken at these meetings are as follows:

Report of the MSA Financial Advisory Committee for 1979

The state of the Society's investments is generally quite satisfactory. Transfer of custody of our securities from Stires & Co. to The Chemical Bank is essentially complete, and the new arrangement is working well.

In contrast to last year's extensive reconstitution of the portfolio, this year has seen only fine-tuning of the list (Table 1). Performance has been highly commendable: market value increased from \$437,427.66 at the beginning of the year to \$557,999.59 December 31. Part of this increase is attributable to the addition of a gift of securities and to reinvestment of interest and dividend income, but even when corrected for these factors the portfolio has grown by 21.9% for the year. As of the end of December, the portfolio's market value represented a gain over cost of \$151,094.97, or 37.1%.

Dividend and interest income from the investment portfolio amounted to \$21,883.75 (Table 2). The current yield (12/31/79) is 4.0% per annum. In addition, the Society earned \$5,507.52 on short-term investment of operating funds, at an average rate of 11.15%. Sale of securities resulted in a net realized capital loss of \$6,895.84 (Table 3).

An important responsibility of this Committee is the analysis and oversight of the Society's general financial operations, as distinct from the investment funds. Such analysis is greatly hampered this year by the lack of adequate reports from our bookkeeping office at AGU. This results in part from the complete turnover in the AGU staff last summer, but the continuing problem is cause for concern.

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Report of the Editor for 1979 (October 1, 1978–September 30, 1979)

Manuscripts received during the twelve months ending September 30, 1979, totalled 184, a decrease from the 231 received during the previous twelve months; the larger number for the preceding year can

be ascribed in part to the 28 manuscripts received for the Frondel-Hurlbut issue (September–October, 1978). Table 1 summarizes the operations of the journal for the period October 1, 1978–September 30, 1979.

The Editor is pleased to report that there was no backlog of manuscripts awaiting publication during 1979. Manuscripts that had passed the review process and were ready for publication were submitted to the printer for whatever issue was then in preparation. All the issues published during the year have been printed and mailed on schedule, thanks to effective cooperation between the editorial office and the printer.

The Editor expresses his appreciation for the efficient services of Ms. Kathleen Krafft as Managing Editor, and for the work of the Associate Editors, which are essential to maintain and improve the quality of the journal. The services of the retiring Associate Editors Professor Gordon E. Brown, Jr., Professor Eric Dowty, and Dr. R.F. Fudali deserve special mention, as do the contributions of Dr. Michael Fleischer and his collaborators on the preparation of "New Mineral Names." Those who have kindly reviewed manuscripts for the journal are listed below.
